Tulsidas Ji is widely revered for his unparalleled devotion to Lord Rama and his invaluable contributions to Indian literature and spirituality.

He is best known for composing the Ramcharitmanas, the saga of Bhagwan Ram in Awadhi, which has profoundly influenced Indian culture, religion, and society. Celebrated with great fervor, the event honours his enduring legacy and reminds us of his teachings, which continue to inspire millions.

Mrs Arun also added that we pay our sincere homage and gratitude to this great saint through various activities, including recitations and explanations, of his works, spiritual discourses, and devotional singing at Ramayana Centre every year. The day is also a reminder of the power of devotion and the transformative impact of literature on society.

She also mentioned that Ramcharitmanas has been included in UNESCO's memory of the World Asia-Pacific Regional Register to give recognition to the significant contribution of this great text.

Dr Jawahar Karnavat, Director of International Hindi Centre, Rabindranath Tagore University, Bhopal, India in his speech explained that Tulsidas's life is a testament to devotion, transformation, and literary brilliance. It is believed that he was born under difficult circumstances, with his mother passing shortly after his birth. Despite his challenging early years, he grew up to be a spiritually inclined scholar deeply devoted to Lord Rama.

Tulsidas's compositions, particularly the Ramcharitmanas, have earned him a place among India's greatest poets and saints. Written in the 16th century in the vernacular language, the Ramcharitmanas brought the story of Lord Rama closer to the masses, making it accessible to people from all walks of life. It is a lyrical masterpiece filled with simplicity, devotion, and universal appeal.

Dr Santosh Choubey, Director Vishva Rang and Chancellor of Rabindranath Tagore University, Bhopal, stated that the Ramcharitmanas is more than a literary work; it is a spiritual guide that emphasizes righteousness, devotion, and the triumph of good over evil.

Through its verses, Tulsidas glorifies the ideals of Lord Rama, portraying him as a symbol of dharma (righteousness) and an epitome of ideal virtues. The text's universal themes of love, loyalty, and moral integrity resonate across generations and cultures, making it a revered scripture not just in India but across the world. It is often recited in temples and homes, especially during religious festivals like Ram Navami, where devotees reflect on the divine virtues of Lord Rama.

Apart from the Ramcharitmanas, Tulsidas composed several other devotional works, including Hanuman Chalisa, Vinay Patrika, and Dohavali. Among these, the Hanuman Chalisa, a 40-verse hymn in praise of Lord Hanuman, is particularly popular. It is believed to provide immense spiritual strength and protection, making it a staple in Hindu households. Tulsidas's other works reflect his deep philosophical insights and unwavering devotion, encouraging seekers to cultivate faith, humility, and selfless service.

Dr (Mrs) Kadambini Acharya, the Director of IGCIC and representative of High Commission of India paid her gratitude to Sant Tulsidas and highlighted his contributions. She stated that Tulsidas's impact extended beyond his writings. He played a significant role in fostering social harmony and spreading the Bhakti movement, a devotional movement that emphasized love and surrender to God over rituals and caste divisions. By composing his works in regional languages, he bridged the gap between the learned and the common folk, empowering ordinary people to connect with spirituality and understand complex philosophical concepts in a relatable way.

Feb 3102 BC. The great war of Mahabharat was fought when he was 89 years old. He died 36 years after this battle.

He is reported to have killed only 4 persons in his life time, namely, Chanoora, the wrestler, Kansa - his maternal uncle, Shishupal and Devantaka - his cousins.

His life was full of great difficulties and challenges. He was born in prison and immediately after his birth, he was separated from his parents and was brought up by his father's cousin, Nand and his wife Yashoda in Gokul. Drought and threat of wild wolves made them shift from Gokul to Vridavan when Shri Krishna was only nine years old.

He stayed in Vrindavan for a period of 18 months and then moved to Mathura and killed Kansa, his own maternal uncle when he was only 10 years and six months old. He never returned to Vridavan again and established his kingdom in Dwarka nearly 1289 metres away from Mathoora. He had innumerable qualities, namely; compassion, patience, forgiveness, justice, impartiality, detachment, invincibility, generosity, beauty, dance, singing, honesty, truth, mastery of all arts, and control over mind and senses. We can learn about his life and contributions from Shrimad Bhagavatam and Mahabharat. His teachings are compiled in Shrimad Bhagavad Gita.

Memorial Lecture: 3 August, 2024

A memorial lecture was held at Ramayana Centre. Union Park on Saturday 3 August 2024 from 14,.00 hrs to 15.30 hrs to mark the 79th Birth Anniversary of Pandit Rajendra Arun, Ex President and Founder member of the Ramayana Centre. The program was conducted under the aegis of the Ministry of Arts and Cultural Heritage.

Several eminent personalities attended the event.



The memorial lecture was delivered by Shri Rajnarain Guttee, Chairman of the Mauritius Qualification Authority who was a close friend to Pandit Rajendra Arun.

During his speech, Shri Guttee commented on Guruji Arun who dedicated himself to the service of Lord Ram and accomplish his "mission" by establishing the Ramayana Centre which culminated in the RAM MANDIR project, comprising of: A Learning Complex, a Spiritual Hall and a magnificent Ram Mandir. After years of struggles and challenges, the vision was finally executed on June 30th, 2017, with the inauguration of the Ram Mandir. The members of the Committee of Management and volunteers of the Ramayana Centre have witnessed that Pt. Rajendra Arun and his wife, Mrs Arun, have left no stone unturned in

the pursuit of this project, and their efforts. This achievement definitely had marked the name of Arun ji in history. Indeed, Pt. Arun was a divine gift to Mauritius. He was the founder and President of the Ramayana Centre and had been actively promoting and propagating the spiritual, social and cultural values flowing therefrom. Pt Arun Ji passed away on 21 June 2021, leaving behind a rich and unforgettable heritage for humankind.

As a person, Arun Ji had been described as courteous, affable, good-natured and generous by his close acquaintances, colleagues and followers. Even a brief encounter with him would win the heart of many people.

VALMİKİ JAYANTİ: 17 OCTOBER, 2024

Valmiki Jayanti was celebrated on Thursday 17 October 2024 from 16.30 hrs to 18.00 hrs at the seat of the Ramayana Centre. On this occasion, students of the Ramayana Centre recited the verses from Valmiki Ramayana.

Dr Vinoo Arun in her speech elaborated on the great contribution of the first poet Maharshi Valmiki who wrote the Ramayana in Sanskrit consisting of 24000 verses. This epic, known as 'Itihas' describes the real incidents of Shri Ram's life.

The Ramayana not only narrates the life and virtues of Lord Rama but also serves as a guide to righteousness, duty, and devotion. Valmiki's portrayal of Rama as an ideal human being reflects profound moral and ethical values, shaping the cultural and spiritual ethos of India for centuries. His eloquent and rhythmic Sanskrit composition set the foundation for classical Indian poetry and inspired countless poets and writers throughout history.

Beyond his literary contributions, Valmiki's life itself is a beacon of transformation and redemption. Born as Ratnakar, a hunter and dacoit, his encounter with divine wisdom led him to renounce his past and embrace the path of spirituality. Through intense meditation and penance, he attained enlightenment, becoming Maharshi Valmiki. His ashram became a center of learning and refuge, where he mentored disciples and played a crucial role in sheltering Sita and raising her sons, Lava and Kusha. By chronicling the triumph of good over evil in the Ramayana and embodying the power of self-transformation, Valmiki

continues to inspire humanity to strive for higher ideals and spiritual awakening.

The students of Ramayana Centre then recited the verses from Ayodhya Kand of Ramcharitmanas where Shri Ram met Sage Valmiki at Chitrakoot which was appreciated by all.

Sita-Ram Vivaah: 7 December, 2024

Ramayana Centre celebrated Sita-Ram Vivaah on Saturday 7 December 2024 from 14:00 - 16:00 hrs. The programme started with a Pooja conducted by the officiating priest. After the Pooja, the young students of the Ramayana Centre recited verses of Ramcharitmanas from Baal Kand and some bhajans together with their Gurus Shri Vishnu Hurry and Shri Roshan Kissoondoyal.

The programme continued with the speech of Dr Vinoo Arun, the President of Ramayana Centre who explained the



significance of wedding and the importance of the four stages of life; Brahmacharya, Gṛhastha, Vanaprastha, and Sannyasa and said that Gṛhastha Ashram is the most important among all which starts with the wedding ceremony. The wedding of Sita-Ram teaches us the ideals of a couple.

In Hindu Dharma, Marriage is a scared and meaningful event that is considered a life-long union of couple and also of two families. It is a sacrament rather than a social contract.

It is seen as a means for the spiritual growth and a way to progress in life. It is believed that marriage is a way to direct energy of a couple's instincts and passions into the progress of their souls.

These festivals are a powerful reminder of the values that shape our lives—faith, courage, and the eternal fight for justice. As we celebrate Navratri and Vijaya Dashami, let us pledge to embody these principles and spread positivity in our families and communities. She pointed out that Shri Ram always believed in well being of everyone, even of his enemy.

When Ravan abducted Sita, Shri Ram reached Lanka with his forces to rescue her. He could have immediately launched an attack on Ravan, but he did not do so. His intention was to avoid bloodshed and have a peaceful solution. Shri Ram consulted Jambavant, the eldest of the group, and asked for his advice. The latter suggested sending Angad as a peace envoy to Ravan. Shri Ram

honoured his advice and instructed Angad on how he should converse with Ravan upon meeting him. He advised Angad to keep two objectives in mind during the conversation:-First, their own objective to be achieved and second no harm occurs to Ravan.

Shri Ram aims for mutual beneficial outcome that harms no one - in brief a win win situation.
